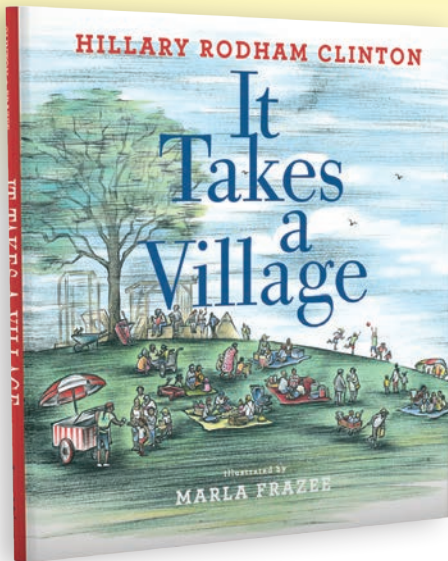

The book's gentle messages about civic engagement and helping and supporting others in the community is more timely now than ever before.

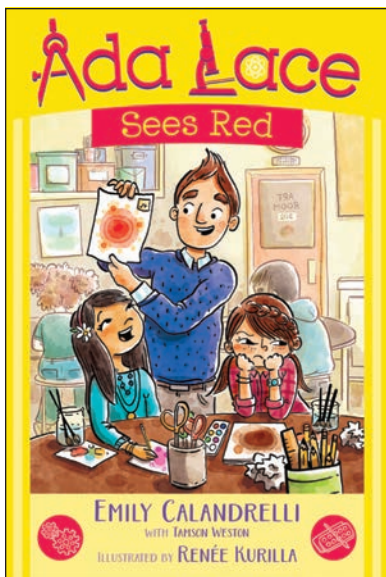

Rather than ignoring this, or trying to pretend it doesn't happen, History's Worst will try to explain how these figures came to be the people they were. In some cases those answers won't be easy to find; however, the books provide historical context, information on the economic and social events of the time in which they lived, and in some cases the motivations—be it revenge, greed, or just anger, that drove these people to act.

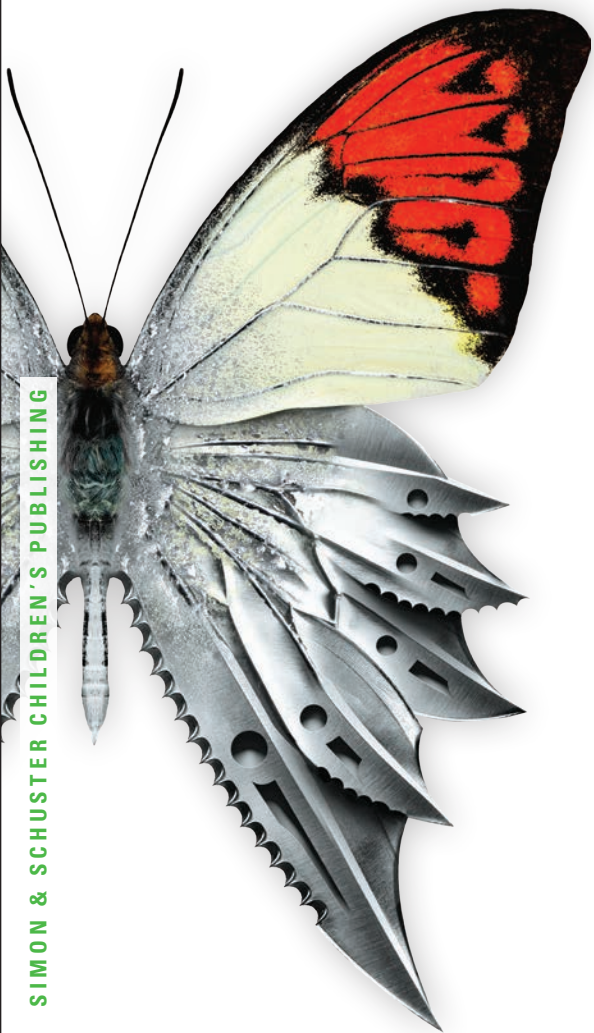
