Each book reveals the cover-ups and complex web of crime and corruption in each story and finally unlocks the secrets to these much-loved, but confusingly incomplete, rhymes.

His own grandfather's battle with dementia, and the increasing impact of the disease in the community, was the inspiration for *Grandpa and Tuska*.
