



Lyrical and deeply moving, *Bound* is a powerful novel about women's bodies, migration, and what it takes to finally loosen the ties that bind us.

Spanning a century and four countries, *Bound* traces the lives of three generations of women bound by history, tradition, and the unspoken legacies they inherit — and resist.

China, 1923: Four-year-old Huan-Ju becomes the first woman in her family to have her feet unbound, escaping an ancient practice but not the limits placed on her life. She dreams of movement, choice, and a world beyond her village.

Malaysia, 1968: Her daughter Shui-Tu, raised in poverty and constraint, believes education will be her escape – a passport to a different future.

Australia, 1980: Lauren, born into suburban comfort, feels unmoored from both her family's past and her own sense of self, forced to reckon with the inheritance she cannot name.

Why this book?

- Readers who loved *Pachinko*, *The Joy Luck Club* or *Do Not Say We Have Nothing* will immediately recognise the emotional territory.
- The women at the centre of the novel are complicated, and sometimes contradictory people, whose choices make sense once you understand the lives they've lived.
- Explores issues around women's bodies, tradition and freedom through everyday moments – food, clothing, family dynamics – rather than overt political commentary.
- Very strong book-club appeal that will spark conversation about family, inheritance and what gets passed down while still being completely story-driven.

SAMANTHA W.L. LEE is a Chinese-Australian writer of literary fiction, essays and poetry. She was shortlisted for the WestWords/Ultimo Prize for her manuscript and completed the WestWords Fellowship in 2023. Samantha has been shortlisted for multiple *Needle in the Hay* flash fiction competitions and has been published in *SBS Voices* and *FemAsia Magazine*.

What if some women just aren't supposed to be mothers? What if it's better if some mothers just walk away?

Ten years ago, Arna walked out on her partner and baby son. She moved countries and built a successful career, convincing herself it was all for the best. Now she's returned home to farewell her dying mother and reconnect with the people she loves. But long-suppressed memories and past mistakes are all still waiting for her there, like live landmines ready to blow up in her face.

People Will Get Hurt By This is a darkly funny, feistily feminist story about bad role models, worse decisions and what happens when women don't do what they're expected to do.

It questions why mothers must sacrifice so much of themselves for their children, when fathers are often allowed to remain precisely who they are.

KATIE NEWTON built her career as a journalist and editor for top New Zealand outlets before turning to fiction. She holds a Master of Creative Writing (First Class Honours) from Auckland University and received the Copyright Licensing scholarship. *People Will Get Hurt By This* is her debut novel.



How to Love the World

A meditation on nature and intergenerational trauma, *How to Love the World* unfolds over a single day – raw, poetic, and as unyielding as the forest itself.

At 9:13 a.m. on a warm morning, textile artist and mother of two Nellika Werner is struck by a falling tree limb while walking her dog in a remote forest.

Pinned and unable to move, Nellika's instinct is to survive: stave off dehydration, signal for help, free herself. But as the hours stretch on, it becomes clear rescue may never come.

As the forest becomes both her captor and confessor, Nellika embarks on an unflinching moral reckoning. Fragmented memories take her back to the scars of her own childhood and forward to the ways she has struggled – and failed – as a mother herself. While her love for her children is fierce, she feels lost in her inability to be the mother she thought she'd be.

ILKA TAMPKE is an award-winning author, academic and teacher. Her first novel, *Skin*, was published in eight countries and was nominated for the Voss Literary Prize and the Aurealis Awards. Her second novel, *Songwoman*, was published in five countries and won the Small Press Network Book of the Year Award. Ilka teaches creative writing at RMIT University.

Why this book?

- *Skin* was published in North America, United Kingdom, Germany, The Netherlands, Denmark, Sweden and Vietnam
- Dives deep into themes of motherhood, love, and redemption and explores how trauma gets passed down through generations
- The prose is just gorgeous – immersive and evocative and the descriptions of the forest are vivid and meditative
- Nellika struggles with motherhood, guilt, and self-worth are real and relatable and despite some themes, it ultimately leaves you feeling hopeful and uplifted

Henry Goes Bush


Peter Carey meets David Mitchell, with the psychological intensity of Colm Tóibín.

In 1892, rising literary star Henry Lawson is sent out of Sydney to 'find the real bush' – a thinly veiled attempt to sober him up, straighten him out, and turn him into a national symbol.

Stranded in Bourke on the edge of the Darling River, Lawson instead finds a town gripped by political unrest, public spectacle and competing versions of the truth.

As myth, history and hallucination begin to blur, Lawson becomes haunted by his own legend and uncertain of which version of himself will survive. The bush offers no redemption – only rupture.

Henry Goes Bush is a darkly comic, formally inventive work of biographical fiction about creativity, colonial myth-making and masculinity, asking what it costs when a nation turns a living writer into a legend.



Why this book?

- This is not a reverent historical novel. Marshall takes the myth of Henry Lawson and quietly blows it apart – reimagining a formative moment in Lawson's life with wit, invention and real emotional depth.
- Rewrites a familiar story in a way that feels fresh, subversive and surprisingly moving.
- At its heart it's about addiction, authorship, and the pressure of being turned into a public symbol.
- Marshall is a genuinely exciting new voice in Australian fiction. He writes with confidence, intelligence and a wicked sense of humour.

WAYNE MARSHALL is a writer and musician. His short fiction has appeared in *Overland*, *Island* and *Going Down Swinging*, among others. He is the author of the short story collection *Shirl*, shortlisted for a Victorian Premier's Literary Award, and a co-founder of the Peter Carey Short Story Award. *Henry Goes Bush* is his first novel.

The Measure of Earl Grey

Everyone is watching. No one sees the truth.

To his neighbours, Earl Grayson is simply the man on Flame Street: the Bookshop Guy, misread and renamed.

Ronnie barely notices him – only the lemon trees leaning over her fence. Lara, whose yard borders both, watches from her baby's room. To her, Earl is Badger: solitary, nocturnal, a man of odd habits and unreadable intentions.

But Earl is watching too. He knows Lara's name. And Ronnie's. He knows more than he should.

When unease spreads through the neighbourhood – a murdered girl, a missing boy, someone tapping at doors in the night – suspicion settles where it always does.

Ronnie fears for her family. Earl is making plans. And Lara, the neighbours whisper, may be coming undone.

Because people see what they expect to see – and sometimes that's the most dangerous thing of all.

Why this book?

- Wolhuter masterfully recruits her readers into its misjudgements. We form opinions early – about Earl, about Lara, about where the danger sits – and then realise how much we've relied on shorthand and assumption.
- Earl is lonely, awkward, middle-aged, physically ungainly – and treated with absolute seriousness and dignity.
- This isn't a thriller about a single bad act – it's about tone, whispers, pattern-making, the way a neighbourhood collectively decides what to be afraid of.
- Lara and Ronnie are not softened or excused. Maternal fear, sexual shame, grief and judgement coexist without flattening them into virtue or villainy.

LOUISE WOLHUTER is the author of the acclaimed *An Afterlife for Rosemary Lamb*, which was published in Australia and the UK and *Shadows of Winter Robins* which won the Fiction Book of the Year award in the 2025 Western Australian Premier's Book Awards. Louise grew up in northern England and now lives in Perth.

A tense literary exploration of complicity and care, friendship and atonement, and the cost of tending to the past rather than leaving it hidden.

When a teenage boy drowns in a small country town, Ruby helps the only witness – her estranged childhood friend Grace – disappear. Believing she understands what really happened, Ruby hides Grace on a vast private property on the edge of town, a place shaped by inheritance, silence, and unspoken histories. Beneath the land lies an ancient cave system, including a rare, naturally occurring camera obscura, where light and memory distort and re-form.

As police scrutiny and media attention intensify, Ruby becomes increasingly entangled in the consequences of her loyalty. Meanwhile, the property's fifth-generation owner begins to confront the buried stories beneath her feet.

ELLA RUBELI is an award-winning journalist, writer, and documentary filmmaker from regional New South Wales. A five-time Walkley Award winner, her work has been published by *The Sydney Morning Herald*, *The Guardian Australia*, SBS, and ABC, and screened at international festivals including SXSW and IDFA. She now lives on Darkinjung Country with her family.

Why this book?

- As a reader, we cannot take our eyes off Ruby. She's conflicted, loyal, frightened and quietly complicit.
- Ideas around inherited violence, buried histories, and media exploitation emerge naturally through character and plot, rather than sitting on the surface as commentary.
- The disappearance and investigation drive the plot, but *The Dreampool's* real focus is atmosphere, interiority, and the social dynamics of a small town under scrutiny, rather than procedural detail.
- Readers will come for the suspense and stay for the voice and moral complexity which make *The Dreampool* a strong candidate for literary prizes, book clubs and festival conversations.

At the heart of Bloomfield Estate lies an old house with iron lacework verandahs and ghosts of the past.

Albert Bloomfield, a widower, watches strangers move into the home that once held his marriage and memories.

Next door, Shandell – on leave from her police job – becomes fixated on the children running wild in Bloomfield House. They resemble faces from the missing-persons board at work, and the man leading them seems lifted from a fairy tale or nightmare.

As Shandell peers through her telescope and fills her notebooks, her conviction grows: the long-feared kidnapper has been hiding in plain sight.

Blending menace and magic, *Bloomfield* is a chilling meditation on family, obsession, and the dangerous power of stories.

A Dark Cloud Passes Over the Sun

Whitney Cutshaw believes in ghosts because she sees them regularly. What she doesn't believe in are cursed books. After her sister Regina – an author and podcaster specialising in the supernatural – dies in a freak accident, Whitney reluctantly takes up Regina's unfinished search for a legendary book known as *Terminus*. If she doesn't, Regina's family could lose everything.

What begins as a sceptical road trip through haunted West Virginia darkens quickly: a mansion steeped in secrets, an ex-con with a story Whitney can't dismiss, a schoolhouse where twelve children were killed.

When Whitney finally unearths *Terminus* at the site of her sister's death and collapses the moment she touches it, she learns that the book is still being written – and that each new story comes true and, more terrifyingly, whoever reads first becomes the main character.

Set primarily in Appalachia, *A Dark Cloud Passes Over the Sun* explores how stories are passed on, how guilt lingers, and how easily a reader can become complicit.

SEAN CONDON is the author of seven books. His first, *Sean and David's Long Drive*, published by Lonely Planet sold over 60,000 copies. He lives in Amsterdam with his wife, daughter and dog.

- Much of the tension comes from what our main characters choose to see, ignore, or pass on, rather than from overt action.



Blending tough lyricism with raw realism, *The Cross Thieves* traces how two boys came to the margins, and why their struggle for meaning drives them to steal a wayside cross. Interwoven letters, church scenes, and fragments of Mandurah's history expand the story into a haunting portrait of cycles of violence, faith, and neglect.

Through letters, church scenes, and fragments of Mandurah's history, *The Cross Thieves* pulls readers deep into a community scarred by violence and neglect, where faith and desperation collide.

Tough, poetic, and unflinching, Alan Fyfe's novel builds toward a climax as devastating as it is inevitable.

ALAN FYFE is a writer and educator living on Noongar country. His debut novel *T* (Transit Lounge, 2022) was listed for the West Australian Premier's Award. His poetry collection *G-d, Sleep, and Chaos* (2024) won the WA Premier's Award for Poetry and overall Book of the Year in 2025.

Why this book?

- Fuses gritty realism with poetic cadences, balancing stark brutality with beauty.
- Fyfe renders his underdog protagonists with compassion, never shying away from their flaws or desperation.
- The brothers' march toward violence reads with the relentless tension of a crime thriller.
- Explores loyalty, revenge, cycles of neglect, and the blurred lines between justice and self-destruction.
- Pell and Gark's devotion to one another drives the plot, even as they disagree on how to honour Lilly.







A father who has been abducted by aliens; a mother who sees the spirits of dead people; a sister who communicates with angry dogs; and 29-year old Noah Grey, whose life has gone off the rails.

In Tasmania, strange lights appear in the skies every summer, signalling we're part of something bigger than the world of our worries. Bigger even than our hopes. When economic pressures force the Greys to live together for one season – the first time in 12 years since Noah left home after college – tensions are fraught.

Things get weird as locals become increasingly convinced the residents at this address have been targeted for alien abduction. As the summer unfolds Noah accepts things will never be normal again, even though his measure is the simplest of all: Family love.

Brendan Colley's *The Season for Flying Saucers* is strange, alluring and tender, a love letter to hope.

Why this book?

- Tom Perrotta's *The Leftovers* meets *The X-Files*
- Masterfully blends drama, mystery, and speculative fiction, creating a reading experience that's both immersive and utterly unique.
- At its heart, this is a story about family – the love, the fractures, and the impact of a long-lost member's return. How do you rebuild trust when the past still lingers?

Brownie cookies

One of the first recipes I ever submitted was a good homemade brownie. Since then, I've eaten countless brownies on my quest for the perfect one (brownie or that's best). But I've consistently produced brownies I think look all the most like elements — thick, chunky, shiny top and fudgy chocolate-y sides — and I think I got the ultimate chocolate-lover's cookie. All the elements of a brownie in portable cookie form, complete with chewy edges and a little chocolate center. Oh, and did I mention that these brownie cookies can be ready to eat in just 20 minutes? (Bangin' brownie!)

NO CHILL
NO MIXER

102 g (3½ cup) dark chocolate (68-70% cocoa), broken into pieces
75 g (⅓ cup) unsalted butter, roughly chopped
200 g (1 cup) coarse sugar or granulated sugar
2 large eggs, room temperature
100 g (⅓ cup) plain flour or all-purpose flour
4½ g (1 cup) cocoa powder
½ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon baking powder
1½ teaspoon salt
75 g (⅓ cup) milk
chocolate chips
sea salt flakes, to decorate

- Preheat the oven to 200°C (390°F) fan-forced. Line two large baking trays or cookie sheets with baking paper or parchment paper.
- In a medium microwave-safe bowl, add the chocolate and butter. Heat in 30-second increments, stirring every 20 seconds, until melted and smooth. Set aside to cool for 2 minutes.
- In a separate large mixing bowl, add the sugar and egg. While by hand for 20-30 seconds until combined.
- Add the melted chocolate mixture to the egg mixture, along with the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder and salt and stir until a smooth brownie-like batter forms. Finally, stir through the chocolate chips.
- The cookie dough will be too soft to roll into your hands, so use a cookie scoop or dessert spoon to portion out roughly 40 g (1½ tablespoons) of dough per cookie. Place the cookies dough on the prepared trays, leaving room for them to spread as they bake.
- Bake the cookies for 12-14 minutes or until they've fattened and cracked on top. Leave the cookies on the baking tray to cool completely — they will be VERY fragile so straight out of the oven.
- Generously sprinkle sea salt flakes on top of the cookies.

Store cookies in an airtight container at room temperature. See page 106 for more cake-related and storage instructions including how to freeze a cookie dough.

Tiramisu cookies

While the popularity of a coffee obsession is well known to me and I can definitely get around a crazy craving for a flat white. And when you take the time to enjoy this fine cookie, you may find something special. These cookies are soft, chewy and fluffy, containing the mouthwatering marriage of chocolate and coffee. When you top that cookie with a homemade mascarpone cream and drizzle on coarse sugar, you have something that is a surprisingly reminiscent of traditional tiramisu. Once baked, these cookies keep well for a few days in the fridge — and are just as delicious! (Lol!)

115 g (⅓ cup) unsalted butter, softened
90 g (⅓ cup) brown sugar or granulated sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 large egg, room temperature
210 g (⅓ cup) plain flour or all-purpose flour
½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
1½ teaspoon finely ground espresso coffee powder
½ teaspoon salt
100 g (⅓ cup) milk
chocolate chips
Mascarpone cream frosting
240 ml (1 cup) thickened cream
165 g (⅓ cup) mascarpone cream
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
coarse sugar

- Preheat the oven to 200°C (390°F) fan-forced. Line two large baking trays or cookie sheets with baking paper or parchment paper.
- In a large mixing bowl, add the butter, brown sugar and coarse sugar and beat using an electric mixer on medium speed until smooth and creamy. Just add the vanilla and egg and beat on medium speed until combined.
- Add the flour, bicarbonate of soda, coffee, salt and sea salt on top. Just stir until a soft cookie dough forms. Stir through the chocolate chips.
- Scoop out roughly 40 g (1½ tablespoons) of cookie dough and roll the dough into a smooth ball using your hands. Place the cookie balls on the prepared trays, leaving room for them to spread as they bake.
- Bake the cookies for 11-12 minutes or until golden brown.
- Transfer the cookies to a wire rack to cool completely (to speed up the process, put the cookies in the fridge to cool).
- Make the mascarpone cream frosting. In a large mixing bowl, add the cream, mascarpone and vanilla. Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed until you reach soft peaks. The cream should be thick and creamy.
- Transfer the frosting to a piping bag fitted with a large round tip (approximately 1.5 cm (5/8 inch) in diameter) or simply use a spoon to apply an even layer of frosting onto the cooled cookies.
- Use a fine sieve to lightly dust the top of the cookies with coarse powder.

NOTES

Cookie dough can turn up the coffee to 2 tablespoons. If you don't have a piping bag and you can use a backlink and tip of the cream. Store finished cookies in an airtight container in the fridge. See page 106 for more make-ahead and storage instructions.

Pistachio cake with lemon cheese frosting

Oh pistachio! I love you so. Is there anything better than a soft, fluffy sponge impregnated with lemon zest and topped with a creamy cheese frosting? I think not. This cooling pistachio but cake was tough to develop with many of my other best cakes being too wet, too dry or too rubbery. But I finally found the ideal mix of ingredients that results in a wonderfully light pistachio sponge to follow my top-but cake.

75 g (⅓ cup) pistachios
230 g (1 cup) casted butter, softened
200 g (⅓ cup) coarse sugar or granulated sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
3 large eggs, room temperature
210 g (⅓ cup) plain flour or all-purpose flour
1½ teaspoon baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
finely ground zest of 1 large lemon
120 ml (½ cup) buttermilk, room temperature
Cream cheese frosting
165 g (⅓ cup) softened cream cheese, softened
finely ground zest of 2 large lemons
30 g (⅓ cup) large, soft shredded cheese, melted
1½ teaspoon fresh lemon juice

- Preheat the oven to 200°C (390°F) fan-forced. Grease and line a 23 x 10 cm (9 x 4 inch) loaf with baking paper or parchment paper, ensuring two sides overlap.
- Use a food processor to pulse the pistachios until you have fine crumbs. If you need to process the pistachios with less than 10 minutes, place the pistachios in a shallow frying pan on medium heat, shaking occasionally for 10 minutes or so, until you reach this level. Remove from pan and set aside to cool completely before decorating the top of the cake.
- In a large mixing bowl, add the butter, coarse sugar and vanilla. Beat with an electric mixer on low speed until combined. Then increase the speed to medium and beat in the butter until pale, creamy and almost fluffy.
- Add the eggs one at a time, and beat briefly by hand — don't worry if the mixture gets a little bit lumpy at this stage. Scrape down the sides of the bowl.
- Add the flour, baking powder, salt, lemon zest and buttermilk. Beat on low speed, and add the shredded cheese. Stir until the cake batter is smooth and creamy (it's not too thick — it's a little thick).
- Spoon the batter into the prepared loaf and smooth the surface.
- Bake the cake for approximately 1 hour and 10 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the middle of the cake comes out clean (the cake is evenly brown after 50 minutes, loosely cover the top with aluminium foil).
- Leave the cake to cool in the tin for 20 minutes before using the cooling/baking paper to carefully lift it out of the tin and putting it on a wire rack to cool completely.
- Make the cream cheese frosting. Place the cream cheese in a large mixing bowl. Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed until smooth and creamy.
- Add the lemon zest, king sugar and lemon juice. Beat on low speed until combined. Turn the mixer up to medium speed and continue to beat until fluffy.
- Spread the cream cheese frosting on top of the cooled cake. Sprinkle the extra pistachio nuts on top.

NOTES

If you aren't going to serve this cake straight away, consider freezing the pistachio nuts on the surface of the cake, removing them just before you eat. Place the pistachio in a shallow frying pan on medium heat, shaking occasionally for 10 minutes or so, until you reach this level. Remove from pan and set aside to cool completely before decorating the top of the cake. Pistachio nuts have been tested on the tin to break. Once frozen, store the cake in an airtight container in the fridge. See page 106 for more storage and freezing instructions.
