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

But maybe there is no right thing. Maybe you don't need anything at all. But you can't tell ...like, you want to put something in your mouth but you're not exactly hungry. Or maybe, like, a constant hunger that will never be sated."

Matilda and Lara are half-sisters who share an unreliable mother and a chaotic past. In every other way, though, they are very different to each other. Lara, ten years younger than Matilda, is a model, living and working in Paris – for her, life is expansive, carefree, beautiful, careless. Matilda's life, in contrast, is solitary, contained, ordered. She works in one of Sydney's buzziest restaurants, Bocca, with a unrequited crush on her boss, celebrity chef Colson. Her life is a precarious, constant highwire balancing act as she tries to hold at a point somewhere between hunger and satiation, but if she's careful and compartmentalised – and she always is – she can keep everything in her life under control.

But when Lara's father, the long-absent, unreliable and erratic Angus Del Ray, comes back into the sisters' lives, with a desire to apologise for them for his past misdeeds, and Lara comes back to Sydney to shoot a Vogue cover, Matilda's ordered and compartmentalised life spins inexorably out of her control. As everything blows apart, Matilda is forced to come to a reckoning with who she is and what she really wants.

'If you think it's hard being a white woman in Australia, try being a black woman.'

These were the words that set a team of journalists at the Adelaide *Advertiser* on an investigation into the mysterious deaths of six young Aboriginal women.

Each year dozens of Indigenous women or girls die by murder or suicide. Rose Hunter-Hebberman was one of them. When her mother, Courtney, uttered those words at an International Women's Day lunch, she had been craving answers for three years as to how her 19-year-old daughter, who had so much to live for, came to die in a run-down back yard shed, apparently by suicide.

Inspired by Courtney's courage and grief, *The Advertiser* team hoped to shed light on Rose's death and put Courtney's mind to rest. But what they found, as their investigation of one death rolled into another five, was disturbing. Lack of urgency, sloppy searches, poor communication, and racist assumptions by police were just some of hallmarks that surrounded the deaths of all these girls.

As the team probed further, the answers, or lack thereof, gave rise to even bigger questions about whether Aboriginal Australians, especially women, have a voice, or if they are heard when they speak.

Based on the podcast *Dying Rose*, this is a compelling look at what it means to be an Aboriginal woman in a world where family love, cultural connection and hope for a better future can be eroded by prejudice and mistrust.

Rick has been a journalist and writer for over fifteen years. He is the winner of the 2013 Kennedy Award for Young Journalist of the Year and the 2017 Kennedy Award for Outstanding Columnist. 

It's the so-called 'scientific' rule that every true-crime lover knows: One death is a tragedy. Two is suspicious. Three is murder. But this mantra – called Meadow's Law – put an innocent woman behind bars for 20 years.

In 2003, Newcastle mother Kathleen Folbigg was found guilty of smothering her four young children to death, one by one. The 'science' posited that it was more likely that a mother would commit quadruple homicide than four infants die of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS). The law agreed, and Kathy was sentenced to 40 years in jail. This book tells the complete, extraordinary story of Kathleen Folbigg's unlawful conviction and her eventual pardon decades later.

It is also a story of science versus the law. Kathleen was convicted before the era of widespread genetic testing, and legal teams ignored evidence that suggested at least two of the children may have died from a heart defect; it was just too complex for anyone to understand properly. Fifteen years later, a group of more than 150 eminent scientists from around the world believed she was innocent. Over the course of two petitions, cross-continental research, and a letter signed by Nobel Prize winners, they sought her immediate release and pardon. And after two decades in prison, Kathleen was acquitted and set free.

This is the biography of one of Australia's most famous murder cases, examining the evidence that both unjustly put Kathleen Folbigg behind bars and then cleared her name 20 years later. Written by the journalist who helped prove her innocence, it contains new information never previously reported to prove that science fought the law, and science won.



Born into a daring, musical family in 1886, Annette Kellerman was a force of nature and made for the stage – her first love – and encouraged to defy social norms from a young age. But after she was diagnosed with rickets as a child she took up swimming for therapy, and soon she became an Australian champion, beating boys, breaking records, and astonishing huge crowds by diving from great heights.

By 1905, Annette was 18 and on her way to England in an attempt to swim the Channel and challenge endurance records in the Thames. 

Vivian Bullwinkel was twenty-seven when a Japanese execution squad marched her and 22 other army nurses into shallow waters on a remote beach near Sumatra.

Some of the women next to her in the doomed line began reciting the Lord's Prayer or calling out the names of people they loved for the final time. Then the machine gun roared out, and amid the cries of her colleagues, Vivian felt a bullet slam into her back and tear through her grey nurses uniform. She fell face forward into salty water that was already becoming red from the blood of her dear friends.

As Vivian waited to die she could hear Japanese soldiers bayoneting some of her friends who still showed signs of life.

Vivian lay perfectly still in the water and to her overwhelming relief soon heard the soldiers marching away from the beach.

Somehow, badly wounded as she was, Vivian was the lone survivor of the massacre.

With her own life spared, she spent the rest of her long life saving others.

Vivian eventually became an inmate at a Japanese prisoner of war camp and spent three years helping other prisoners get through their living hell.

When peace was eventually restored she became one of the most important figures in Australian nursing and was a key driver of Operation Babylift, the mass rescue of young orphans during the Vietnam War.

In 2023, the late Lieutenant Colonel Vivian Bullwinkel became the first woman to be honoured with a statue at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra, a statue that pays tribute to the extraordinary bravery, courage and love for humanity of an Australian country girl who had devoted her long life to helping other people.



Nick Kaldas was born in Egypt in 1958. In 1969 his family fled to Australia. In 1981 After graduating from the NSW Police Force's academy, he worked for more than ten years as a hostage negotiator. Later, as head of the New South Wales homicide squad, Kaldas was responsible for a number of high-profile murder investigations, including the murder of John Newman and the investigation into the murders committed by Sef Gonzales Then, in 2004 Kaldas spent eight months in Iraq where he trained the local police. He was seconded to the Special Tribunal for Lebanon investigating the 2005 assassination of Rafic Hariri. On 4 March 2016 Kaldas announced his decision to leave the Police Force. Most recently he has been Commissioner and Chair of the Royal Commission into Veteran Suicide.





Max Dupain (1911-1992) was a major cultural figure in Australia who was at the forefront of the visual arts in a career spanning more than fifty years. During this time he produced a number of images now regarded as iconic (The Sunbaker, Meat Queue, Form at Bondi, At Newport). He championed modern photography and a distinctive Australian approach.

However, to date Dupain has been seen mostly in one-dimensional, limited and limiting terms – as exceptional, as super masculine, as an Australian hero. But this landmark biography approaches him as a complex and contradictory figure who, despite the apparent certitude of his photographic style, was filled with self-doubt and anxiety. Dupain was a Romantic and a rationalist and struggled with the intensity of his emotions and reactions. He wanted simplicity in his art and life but found it difficult to attain. He never wanted to be ordinary.

Examining the sources of his creativity – literature, art, music – alongside his approach to masculinity, love, the body, war, and nature, *Max Dupain: A Portrait* reveals a driven artist, one whose relationship to his work has been described as 'ferocious' and 'painful to watch'. Photographer David Moore, a long-term friend, said he 'needed to photograph like he needed to breathe. It was part of him. It gave his drive and force in life.'

On a warm summer's evening in February 2014, eleven-year-old Luke Batty was killed by his father at cricket practice. It was a horrific act of family violence that shocked Australia. The next morning, his mother Rosie bravely stood before the media. Her powerful and gut-wrenching words about family violence galvanised the nation and catapulted her into the spotlight. From that day on, Rosie Batty campaigned tirelessly to protect women and children, winning hearts and minds with her courage and compassion, singlehandedly changing the conversation around domestic violence in this country. Rosie's remarkable efforts were recognised when she became the 2015 Australian of the Year and a year later she was named one of the World's Greatest Leaders by *Fortune* magazine. However, behind Rosie's steely public resolve and seemingly unbreakable spirit, she was a mum grieving the loss of her adored son.

What happens when you become an accidental hero? What happens the day after the worst day of your life? What happens when you are forced to confront the emptiness and silence of a house that once buzzed with the energy of a teenage son?

You go to dark places from which you're not sure you'll ever recover.

Rosie Batty is a leader in the crusade against domestic violence, especially against women and children. This was sparked by a horrific loss: in an incident that shocked Australia, Rosie Batty's 11-year-old son was killed by his father at cricket training, who was then himself shot by police. Rosie has since turned her personal tragedy into a fight to help others. Her relentless work in this area resulted in Rosie being named the 2015 Australian of the year and awarded the Pride of Australia National Courage Medal. She was named as a founding member of the Council of Australian Governments advisory panel on preventing violence against women, and was the Chair for a Victim Survivors' Advisory Council for the Victorian Government as a response to the country's first Royal commission into Family Violence. *Fortune Magazine* named Rosie one of its top 50 world's greatest leaders and Rosie was voted the most influential person in the Not for Profit sector on Pro Bono Australia's Impact 25 list and has been inducted into the Victorian Honour Roll of Women. In 2019, Rosie was appointed as an officer in the Order of Australia, recognised for her distinguished services to the community. Her memoir, *A Mother's Story* (2015), was a national bestseller.
