




ZOË FOSTER BLAKE writes fiction, non-fiction and children's picture books because she enjoys hijacking shelf space across multiple genres in bookshops.

Her books have received numerous short-listings and awards while her picture book, *The Sound of the Sea*, was a CBCA Honour Book.

Jacqueline speaks to thousands of young people at schools and festivals around the world, and says the characters in her books are often made up of the best bits of children she's met over the years. While she is not a twin, like Kensy and Max she does have excellent powers of observation and has always thought she'd make a great spy.








SONYA HARTNETT'S work has won numerous Australian and international literary prizes and has been published around the world. Uniquely, she is acclaimed for her stories for adults, young adults and children. Her accolades include the Commonwealth Writers' Prize (*Of A Boy*), The Age Book of the Year (*Of A Boy*), the Guardian Children's Fiction Prize (*Thursday's Child*), the Children's Book Council of Australia Book of the Year for both Older and Younger Readers (*Forest, The Silver Donkey, The Ghost's Child, The Midnight Zoo* and *The Children of the King*), the Victorian Premier's Literary Award (*Surrender*), shortlistings for the Miles Franklin Award (for both *Of a Boy* and *Butterfly*) and the CILP Carnegie Medal (*The Midnight Zoo*). Hartnett is also the first Australian recipient of the Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award (2008). *Golden Boys*, Sonya's third novel for adults, was shortlisted for the 2015 Miles Franklin Literary Award and she also published her third picture book, *The Wild One* in 2014.

LUCIA MASCIULLO grew up in Livorno, Tuscany. She moved to Australia in 2007 and since then she has been happily working as an illustrator. She has illustrated more than 20 books, among which are the CBCA Honour Book and Prime Minister Award short-listed *Come Down, Cat!* by Sonya Hartnett, and the Our Australian Girl series. ALFIE THE BRAVE

Richard Harris and Simon Howe (illus.)

A delightful picture book about how bravery doesn't always come naturally, from Dr Richard 'Harry' Harris, a key member of the international cave-diving group who rescued the Wild Boar soccer team in Thailand.

Alfie was a fine-looking dog.

His coat was sleek and shiny like an otter.

His muscles stood out under his skin.

He was the son of champions. But Alfie didn't feel like a champion. Alfie was scared of . . . everything! Could Alfie ever be bold and brave like other dogs?

Sales Points

- Dr Richard Harris's profile continues to be prominent via the various TV film/documentary versions of the incredible Thai cave-diving rescue story, and with the feature film *Thirteen Lives* directed by Ron Howard set for post-production / US release in April 2022. (Filming began in March 2021.) Dr Harris is being played by Joel Edgerton. (*Loving, Zero Dark Thirty*) Other stars include Viggo Mortensen and Colin Farrell.
- Alfie the Brave shares Dr Richard Harris's message to children that he wants to convey after his experiences in the Thai Cave Rescue and as Australian of the Year in 2019 about how bravery or courage doesn't always come naturally.
- An appealing and funny picture book with a positive message that will appeal to families and schools. Kids will laugh at Alfie's fears but also identify with them. A gorgeous book to explore this theme with children aged 0–5.







Adrian draws on his showbiz roots to create engaging, interactive school presentations and is passionate about fostering a love of reading among the next generation.


TODAY'S SUN





A mind-boggling expedition into the secrets of the Animal Kingdom with only an invisible map of the human heart as a guide. (Unless, of course, you count the talking parrot.) What on Earth could possibly go wrong ...?

Sal has always had an affinity with animals - especially the lost kind. But when two rare and endangered creatures appear out of nowhere, life takes a detour into strange and uncharted territory ...

One elephant, one kakapo, one unlicensed teenage driver, one boy waiting for the world to end and a twelve-year-old girl with a very special gift.

Sales Points

- Lisa Nicol's signature guirk and strong narrative voice elevate this wonder-filled story for middle readers to . stand out from the pack. This is a book that celebrates the unusual and the misfits and is a poignant and timely story about family, finding your voice and the importance of the natural world.
- The What on Earth Institute of Wonder entwines many themes within a beautifully unusual story:
 - Ecology the natural world and endangered animals, as well as the relationship between the human world and Nature.
 - Wonder in a world where we strive for answers and knowledge, the question is raised (and aptly left unanswered) about whether the act of 'wondering' should suffice.
 - Unusual a celebration of both people and places and animals that stand out and apart, that don't 'fit in'.
 - Strong female central character, with both a younger and older boy character who are also always a part of the driving action.
 - Strong education potential with themes of environment, animals, family, overcoming obstacles.
- Male and female lead characters mean both boys and girls aged 8-12 will love it.







LISA NICOL is an Australian author and sometimes documentary-maker. Her feature Wide Open Sky about a children's choir in far west NSW won the Audience Award for Best Documentary at the 2015 Sydney Film Festival and screened in cinemas and festivals around the world.
