
Beyond Year Zero by Lawrence Held





This book seeks to give the reader that kind of understanding. By lifting the lid on the grand strategy of a modern fighting force, we'll find out what principles govern our thinking and decision making.

Paul Barnes is a serving British offer in the Army. He has deployed on operations to the Former Yugoslavia, Northern Ireland, Iraq, and Afghanistan. He is currently a doctrine writer at the Army's Land Warfare Centre in Wiltshire.






