H. Lee Barnes, former Green Beret, deputy sheriff and narcotics agent, has published eight books, including three novels and three collections of short stories. His latest novel *Cold Deck*, Univ. of Nevada Press (2013) focuses on a cheating scam in a Las Vegas casino. His short fiction has received the Willamette Fiction Award and the Arizona Authors Assn. Fiction Award. In 2013, he was honored with the Excellent in the Arts Award for Literary Arts from the Vietnam Veterans of America. He currently teaches English and fiction writing at the College of Southern Nevada.



As a NARC, Barnes was involved in the shooting death of an armed suspect. In the months that followed, he was first arrested for manslaughter, cleared by a grand jury, re-arrested for murder, and cleared again by a judge at an evidentiary hearing when two state's witnesses admitted they'd perjured their testimony. His unique experience gives the kind of authority he brought to the pages of *Searchlight*.

When World War II breaks out, Evelyn Brittain is a happy-go-lucky Auckland teenager who loves nothing more than going to the movies with her friends. By 1944, however, Auckland is fizzing with American soldiers and jazz music and, for seventeen-year-old Evelyn, first love in the form of trumpet playing GI, Walter Franklin. Walter and his unit are stationed at Auckland's Victoria Park Barracks for R & R following a harrowing Pacific Theatre experience.

For Evelyn, briefly, it is the most thrilling of times. Walter woos her and even manages to win over her mother. And by the time he ships out again, Evelyn is wearing a sparkling engagement ring. When the war claims her brother's life, however, and she learns that Walter is presumed dead, a world of adult tragedy is laid on her young shoulders.

Evelyn plummets into a depression and uses a dangerous sexual encounter as a salve to her pain. Nine months later she gives birth to a son, Allan, who she tearfully surrenders to adoptive parents.

Years later, married with two daughters and a second son, Kenneth, Evelyn continues to seesaw between contentment and despair. When Kenneth drowns in the bath and Evelyn's marriage breaks down, she abandons her daughters, moves into a boarding house and suffers a breakdown. She then becomes obsessed with spying on Allan—a move that nearly destroys all that she has left.

VISION QUEST

This historical novel relates the extraordinary story of Willa, a psychology graduate student in 1970. After participating in a sensory deprivation experiment as part of her studies, she develops symptoms of xenoglossia, including the inexplicable ability to speak and read French fluently, and visions and memories of an eighteenth-century French explorer. Her search of historical places and records begins out of a general curiosity. However, the visions persist and expand from the experiment to her dreams, until finally dominating her thoughts. Her search becomes urgent and obsessive, but hope of finding the root and resolution of her malady fades. With the help of her father, she is able to piece together clues and make an important discovery that renews her spirit and reassures her that her symptoms have a basis in reality.

Set within the tumultuous time of social unrest, campus riots and protests against the Vietnam War, we travel with Willa as she struggles with obsessive search for the truth, her depression, an increasingly tense relationship with her psychologist boyfriend, and her attempt to enlist the assistance of a most unlikely ally. She tests the depth of her inner strength and character while she explores the rich history of French voyagers in the upper Great Lakes, and the challenges of diagnosis and treatment of delusional behavior.




THE SECRET VINDALOO





on the unsuspecting population. From that moment Desmond is no longer in league with SAI, but rather is intent on stopping the maniacal entity from fulfilling its destiny.

DRAGON FIRE TRILOGY, BOOK 1: BROKEN SKIES



DOUBLEWIDE

Ranger Parks is a miracle baby who was stillborn and had life breathed into him by his iron-willed mother. Living through a life of disappointment and family tragedy, Ranger, his innocence scraped away as he passes from childhood to adulthood, nevertheless reclaims the hope that prevailed in his wide-eyed youth. He becomes a hero in every sense of the word because he does not succumb to anger or cynicism as events unfold, rather he opens his own unique Pandora's Box, filled with his own set of challenges and tragedies. But at the bottom also rests his hope, his ability to change and adjust. With a deft hand and a sharp wit, the author pulls the reader into the realization that we all have that unique box to open as we move toward our adult selves.

Doublewide is a mix of humor, drama, with a touch of suspense, in the style of character-driven storytelling used by authors such as Nicholas Sparks, Robert James Waller, and Ian McEwen.

ERIK EDSTROM

Erik Edstrom was born in Boston and raised by his father after being abandoned by his mother at age 12. As an adolescent, he found refuge in academics and sports. After watching the Twin Towers fall on TV, he was eager to make his contribution to his country. He received an appointment to attend the US Military Academy at West Point and, always competitive, he committed himself to the grueling training to become the youngest person ever to pass officer selection for the U.S. Special Forces. In Afghanistan, Edstrom served as a platoon leader, leading combat missions in Kandahar and a



Presidential Escort to President Obama. He is a recipient of the Bronze Star Medal, and winner of the 2012 Best Ranger Competition Rippetoe Trophy.

He later attended the University of Oxford, completing a dual degree as both an MBA and MSc in Environmental Change and Management. He now lives in Melbourne and works for Australia's First 100% Impact Investment Venture Capital Fund, investing in early stage businesses with a positive social or environmental impact.

A WAR WITHOUT QUALITIES

A captivating and thought-provoking memoir detailing an infantry officer's extraordinary experiences as a platoon leader in the Afghanistan war. After graduating from West Point, Eric Edstrom's unit is deployed to Afghanistan. Initially passionate and dedicated to serving his country, and playing his part in bringing the conflict to a decisive victory, Edstrom finds himself confronted by the futility, intentional barbarism and bureaucracy of war. THE CLOSET OF MEMORIES

The Closet of Memories tells the story of an international aide worker who becomes embroiled in the Syrian war, the on-going refugee crisis, and the post-coup purge in Turkey. The story unravels in retrospect as seen through the eyes of the protagonist Edris: A humanitarian agency called "Cure Across Borders" has opened a rehabilitation center for victims of torture in Istanbul. Meant for Syrians who escaped the regime prisons in Syria, this rehab center is a cherished project of Edris, who heads the agency's programs in Turkey. It has been four years since Edris left his job in Washington to become an aide worker. He first served in Syria during the civil war, and then in Turkey during the refugee crisis. After a failed coup attempt in Turkey, a massive purge is launched in the country, while the war in Syria ends in a detente. A few months later, the rehab center is inundated with new patients, many of them Turks. And then, one by one, patients begin to disappear. Edris notices signs of his own encroaching PTSD, as he finds himself entangled in a conspiracy. Or is it really a conspiracy? Maybe Edris is just delusional – the trauma of his years in conflict zones clouding his judgment.

MANOEL CARLOS KARAM

Manoel Carlos Karam was born in the town of Rio do Sul in 1947 and moved to Curitiba, in southern Brazil, at the age of 19. It was there that he made his career as a journalist and playwright, eventually retiring from both professions so he could focus on writing fiction.



Before his death in 2007, he published seven books, wrote twenty plays and became one of the most beloved figures of the city's artistic scene. At once both ironic and absurd, Karam's works call to mind playwrights such as Ionesco, Stoppard and Pirandello, and his works compare to such classics as *Rosencrantz & Guildenstern Are Dead* or *Six Characters In Search of an Author*. *The Journal of the War Against the Taedos* was published posthumously in 2008.

THE WAR AGAINST THE TAEDOS

"In short: it was the war between the Sons of Light and the Sons of Darkness, all of them Sons-of-Bitches."

So goes the first entry of Manoel Carlos Karam's *Journal of the War Against the Taedos* (Kafka Ediçoes, 2008, Brazil). What follows are a series of similarly biting journal entries detailing a war between "us" and "them" – those Taedos who could be anyone, anywhere, at any time. As such, there is no traditional plot to the "Taedos" tale, but pick any real-world conflict and you can make a strong case that this book is a fictional version of it. The book treats its readers to a series of vignettes that flesh out a conflict between neighboring countries without ever telling us why they fight or who wins. Much like in real war, the soldiers obey orders they don't quite understand for purposes that only higher-ups can (but don't) tell. These vignettes are mixed in with snippets of propaganda, depositions from spies and historians, defections and battle schemes, all dutifully chronicled by the "journal writer." However, even this assiduous writer is incapable of telling us what is so terrible about the "Taedos" that would put us at constant war with them. As our narrators tells us toward the end: "This note on politics is necessary so that no one, in reading this journal that mentions kings, queens and presidents, might think the historian is confused. The confusion, in this case, belongs to history."

Jens Madsen turns out to be the local head of a worldwide drug smuggling ring, the Ukrainian Brotherhood. Madsen only wants to make a little extra money for his golden years, but when he becomes ensnared in a nuclear attack on Frankfurt, things start falling apart.

During the attack, John is in the city with a new girlfriend. She and her baby are killed, and John only survives by using all his skills and ingenuity. An FBI agent recruits John to take him back into Sarajevo to help prevent a second nuclear blast. Barely escaping with their lives, the two men succeed, and John is sent on a revenge mission against the Brotherhood, with Rank on his trail.

Whether it is tracking down her own sister's killer (*Surrender*), to discovering one convicted killer may not be the real threat to a child's life (*My Brother's Keeper*), to reluctantly taking on a 14-year-old closed case on what had long been determined an accidental death (*My Mother Said*), her investigations often become personal obsessions to uncover the real truth. SURRENDER

In this second book featuring missing person's expert Diane Rowe, she is faced with a case that is far more complex than at first appears. When ex-con Karen contacts her, and asks her to find her 14-year-old daughter Sunny, Diane doesn't hesitate—until she finds out Karen was in jail for murdering her son and attempting to kill Sunny. However, Karen insists she is a changed woman and is adamant that her daughter is in danger.

Tracking down the girl is easy. Convincing the father to allow Karen access to their daughter is not so easy. He has remarried and put his life back together after the tragic events seven years ago. He has also produced another son, who is now the same age as his first son was when he was drowned. Despite her father's objections, Sunny insists on meeting Karen face-to-face, but before the meeting can take place, Karen turns up dead.

Who killed Karen and why? What is the danger to Sunny that Karen alluded to? Or is the new little brother the one in danger? Can lives this time be saved? Or does the same fate await them as that of the innocent child murdered seven years ago?

MY MOTHER SAID

When an 18-month-old child went missing from the seaside village of Piha, suspicion turned on the girl's drug and alcohol-addicted mother, Ramona. Rumors were rife. A child witness claimed to have seen the girl near the flooded creek the afternoon she went missing, but without any hard evidence against Ramona, the police closed the case, calling the child's death "a tragic accident."

Fourteen years later Ramona turns up in the life of missing person's expert Diane Rowe. She's married Diane's estranged father Bryan, and Ramona insists her daughter didn't drown – that she was kidnapped.

Diane's investigation follows the long cold tracks that take her from the picturesque beauty of New Zealand through the secret undercover world of the traveling circus, to the heart of darkness of grungy, industrial Berlin in an increasingly desperate attempt to learn the truth of what happened to the child who went missing fourteen years ago. She is determined to find the answers. But she may wish she'd never asked ...
